THE UGANDA ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1902.

PROCLAMATION.

I, HENRY RICHARD WALLIS, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Deputy to the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate, in exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Uganda Order in Council, 1902, Article 6 (1) with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Colonies do hereby declare as follows:—

1. The description of the boundary of the Lango District contained in the fourth Schedule to the Proclamation under the above-mentioned Order in Council dated the 11th July, 1912, is hereby varied by deleting therefrom all words occurring therein from and including the words—

“It then follows the Tochi River” to the end thereof and substituting therefor the following, *viz.*:—

“It then follows the thalweg of the Tochi River to the “confluence of that River and the Abega River, thence “it follows a straight line to the summit of Mount “Moru, thence it follows a straight line in a North-“Easterly direction to the confluence of the Asua River “and the Udek River: thence it follows the Asua River “to its point of commencement.”

2. The Northern Province shall be divided into the Districts of:—

1. Bunyoro.
2. Gulu.
3. Chua.
4. West Nile.

3. The boundaries of the Districts of Bunyoro, Gulu, Chua and West Nile, shall be as described in the Schedule hereto.

4. The Proclamations under the above-mentioned Order in Council dated respectively the 10th October, 1912, the 7th August, 1913, and the 29th May, 1914, are hereby cancelled, and the second Schedule to the Proclamation under the said Order in Council dated the 5th April, 1907, is hereby varied in accordance with this Proclamation.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of Districts in the Northern Province.

BUNYORO DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point on the Anglo-Congolese Boundary on the parallel of 2° 7' North Latitude halfway between the shores of Lake Albert the Boundary of the Bunyoro District runs in a straight line in a North-Easterly direction to the point at which the Victoria Nile enters Lake Albert; thence it follows the thalweg of that river in an Easterly and Southerly direction to its confluence with the river Kafu; thence it follows the thalwegs of the Rivers Kafu and Nkussi to Lake Albert. From the point at which the River Nkussi enters Lake Albert it runs due North till it intersects the Anglo-Congolese Boundary in Lake Albert; and then it follows that Boundary to the point of commencement.

## GULU DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point on the Anglo-Congolese Boundary on the parallel of 2° 7' North Latitude halfway between the shores of Lake Albert the Boundary of the Gulu District runs in a straight line in a North-Easterly direction to the point at which the White Nile (Bahr-el-Gebel) flows out of Lake Albert and follows the thalweg of that river to the South-Eastern extremity of the Balala Swamp; thence it follows a straight line in a Westerly direction to a point on the river Atula 18 miles from its confluence with the White Nile; thence it follows a straight line in a North-Easterly direction to a point 3 miles due West of Lufferi Rest Camp; thence it follows a straight line to the source of the River Ayu; thence it follows the thalweg of the River Ayu to its confluence with the River Nyaura; thence it follows the Uganda-Sudan boundary to its point of intersection of the River Asua; thence it follows the River Asua upstream to its confluence with the River Udek; thence it follows a straight line in a South-Westerly direction to the summit of Mount Moru; thence it follows a straight line to the confluence of the Rivers Abega and Tochi; thence it follows the thalweg of the River Tochi to its confluence with the Victoria Nile; thence it follows the thalweg of the Victoria Nile to its entry into Lake Albert and thence it runs in a straight line to its point of commencement.

## CHUA DISTRICT.

Commencing at the point of intersection of the parallel of 4° North Latitude and the parallel of 34° East Longitude the Boundary runs in a straight line in a South-Westerly direction to a point on the Southern foothills of Mount Napono; thence in a straight line to the confluence of the Rivers Udek and Asua; thence in a North-Westerly direction following the thalweg of the River Asua downstream to the point on that river at which the Uganda-Sudan boundary intersects the river. It then follows the Uganda-Sudan boundary in a North-Easterly direction to the Southernmost point at the bottom of Mount Harogo; thence it runs in a straight line to its point of commencement.

## WEST NILE DISTRICT.

Commencing at a point on the Anglo-Congolese Boundary on the parallel of 2° 7' North Latitude halfway between the shores of Lake Albert the Boundary of the West Nile District follows the Western boundary of the Gulu District to the confluence of the Rivers Ayu and Nyaura; thence it follows the Uganda-Sudan boundary in a Westerly direction to its intersection with the Anglo-Congolese Boundary, which boundary it follows to its point of commencement in Lake Albert.

SIR,

With reference to Mr. Bonar Law's Circular despatch of the 30th of August, on the subject of the Imperial Institute, I have the honour to transmit to you the accompanying copy of three Resolutions adopted by an Inter-Departmental Committee which was appointed to define the spheres of work of the Imperial Institute and the Commercial Intelligence Branch of the Board of Trade.

2. I have to explain that, in view of the increased attention which has been paid, especially since the outbreak of war, to the importance of obtaining the fullest possible information as to the resources of the Empire in raw materials, with the object of the utilisation of those resources for purposes of commercial development, it was felt that some danger existed lest the work in this direction which was being carried on by the Department and the Institute might lead to an overlapping of their functions and to consequent waste of energy.

3. It was accordingly decided to appoint an Inter-Departmental Committee over which the Right Honourable Lewis Harcourt, M.P., then First Commissioner of Works, was good enough to preside, and it is hoped that the decision embodied in the enclosed Resolutions, which have been unanimously agreed to by the Committee, will ensure a satisfactory delimitation of the spheres of work of the two departments as well as close and cordial co-operation between them.

4. I shall be glad if you will take steps, by publishing this despatch in the *Official Gazette* or in such other manner as you may deem suitable, to give publicity to the new arrangement.

RESOLUTIONS OF INTER-DEPARTMENTAL COMMITTEE ON CO-OPERATION BETWEEN THE  
BOARD OF TRADE AND THE IMPERIAL INSTITUTE.

(1) The Imperial Institute should deal with enquiries as to the sources of supply of raw materials produced within the Empire in connexion with their industrial and commercial utilisation. Either the Board of Trade or the Imperial Institute may deal with enquiries as to supplies immediately available, but the Board of Trade should as a rule deal with enquiries for ordinary supplies of well-recognised raw material through the usual trade channels.

(2) The Imperial Institute should undertake all necessary investigations of the value and uses of raw materials produced within the Empire.

(3) The Imperial Institute and the Board of Trade should co-operate in cases in which the questions concerned involve special statistical and trade information as well as technical treatment.

2. Until this restriction has been withdrawn no Passports can be endorsed permitting women and children to travel through any danger zone.

3. This restriction does not apply to women and children travelling to India, South Africa or any country outside a danger zone."

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address *in the same country*, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses is specifically mentioned.

\*NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for

firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is however, prepared, on application, to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants, in making enquiries, would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to His Majesty's Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.
