NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on
business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited
from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms
mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the
Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation,
1916, No. 3.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the
List has more than one address in the country or groups of
countries under which the name of the person or firm
appears, all dealings in that country or in any country in
the group with such person or firm are prohibited, even in
cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the
countries is specifically mentioned.

*NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading
with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th
November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality
resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia,
Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or
firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from
trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any
of those countries, even though such person or firm is not
mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any
inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by
the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the
Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade
Department is collecting and classifying the names of
non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for
firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable
amount of information is already available at the Foreign
Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to
suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the
necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department
is however, prepared, on application, to enquire of His
Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable
substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by
telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of
telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the
work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants, in
making enquiries, would specify the particular trade or
trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is
telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Repre-
sentative in that country, who is instructed to notify
accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons
abroad should apply for information as to names on the
List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with
agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised
to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List
as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or
South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's
Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to His
Majesty's Consul-General at New York and to other
centres in the United States likely to be interested.

PLAGUE.

The attention of the Public is called to the fact that Nairobi Township is still in Quarantine owing to presence of Plague and the following regulations are still in force:—

Infectious Diseases Rules, 1913.—No Asiatic or African will be allowed to leave Nairobi by rail unless he or she has undergone Medical Observation for 14 days or unless he or she can produce evidence of inoculation against Plague 7 days or more previously.

Inoculation Against Plague.—Hours for Europeans, daily between 9 and 10 a.m., and 2 and 3 p.m. Hours for Asiatics and Africans, daily between 12 noon and 3 p.m. All persons requiring inoculation are requested to conform to the hours above stated. Persons inoculated over six months must undergo re-inoculation before leaving.

It should be noted that under no circumstances will Railway Passes be issued unless the above conditions are complied with.

Europeans who are liable to be called away on short notice are requested to have their servants inoculated immediately so as to save disappointment.

Permits to travel are issued to inoculated persons between the hours of 9 and 11 a.m. on all week days.

Steamship Companies are demanding that all Europeans leaving Mombasa must show evidence of having been inoculated within the previous three months.

European passengers for Zanzibar must show evidence of inoculation 7 or more days previous to leaving.
