PROCLAMATION.

I HEREBY DECLARE that the District of Chua in the Northern Province shall cease to be a "closed district" for the purposes of the above-mentioned Ordinances.

RULES.

THE MASTERS AND SERVANTS RULES (EASTERN PROVINCE No. 2), 1917.

THESE RULES may be cited as "The Masters and Servants Rules (Eastern Province No. 2), 1917."

2. The Masters and Servants Rules (Eastern Province), 1917, are hereby cancelled but without prejudice to any penalty incurred or the prosecution of any offence committed before the date of these Rules.

THE GAME ORDINANCE, 1913.

NOTICE.

I HEREBY NOTIFY that the Proclamation under the above-mentioned Ordinance dated the 13th June, 1914, shall apply to the following area:—

That portion of Buddu Saza bounded on the South by the Bukakata—Mbarara road, on the East by Victoria Nyanza, on the West by the Kyogia River and on the North by the road known locally as the Kitete from the point where it crosses the Kyogia swamp near Musenyi up to the point where it passes Lusasa thence following a line direct to the mouth of the Kafu River.

THE UGANDA CUSTOMS CONSOLIDATION  
ORDINANCE, 1904.

NOTICE.

THE NOTICES under the above-mentioned Ordinance dated the 9th December, 1915, the 14th July, 1916, the 29th July, 1916, the 29th August, 1916, the 28th September, 1916, the 23rd October, 1916, the 14th November, 1916, the 27th December, 1916, the 19th January, 1917, the 13th March, 1917, the 29th March, 1917, the 30th April, 1917, the 11th May, 1917, and the 27th June, 1917, are hereby cancelled and the provisions thereof consolidated and amended.

1. I hereby prohibit the exportation of the following articles to all ports and destinations in Sweden, *viz.*:—

All articles which are not by virtue of any Notice for the time being in force made under the above-mentioned Ordinance, prohibited to be exported to Sweden except:—

- (1) Printed matter of all descriptions;
- (2) Empty receptacles returned to Sweden;
- (3) Worn clothing and other personal effects;
- (4) Live animals other than animals ordinarily used for human food;

2. I hereby prohibit the exportation of all articles to the Netherlands unless consigned to any of the following persons, *viz.*:—

The Government of the Netherlands or any Department thereof (provided that the permission of the Governor is previously obtained); any British Diplomatic or Consular Officer in the Netherlands or any Diplomatic or Consular Officer in the Netherlands of an allied or neutral country (provided that in the case of consignments to Diplomatic or Consular Officers of neutral countries the permission of the Governor is previously obtained); the Netherlands Oversea Trust or (in the case of any prohibited or restricted goods which are authorized by licence to be exported the person named in the licence as consignee, provided that this prohibition shall not apply to the following articles, *viz.*:—

- (1) Printed matter of all descriptions;
- (2) Empty receptacles returned to the Netherlands;
- (3) Worn clothing and other personal effects;
- (4) Live animals other than animals ordinarily used for human food;
- (5) Sanitary earthenware without fittings of any kind;
- (6) Pottery and common earthenware for table and household purposes;

- (7) Books ;
- (8) Dolls and toys (except electric torches) ;
- (9) Wooden clock cases ;
- (10) Slates and slate pencils ;
- (11) Postage stamp albums and picture post card albums.
- (12) Tiles.

3. I hereby prohibit the exportation of the goods mentioned in the Schedule hereto as follows:—

- (1) Goods marked "a" to all ports and destinations other than ports and destinations in the United Kingdom, British Possessions and Protectorates ;
- (2) Goods marked "b" to all destinations in foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas other than France and French Possessions, Russia, Italy and Italian Possessions, Spain and Portugal, and to all ports in any such foreign countries and to all Russian Baltic Ports ;
- (3) Goods marked "c" to all destinations other than the United Kingdom, British Possessions and Protectorates, and France, Italy and Russia (except through Baltic Ports).

4. Nothing in this Notice shall affect the provisions of The Ostrich Ordinance, 1909.

5. The Prohibitions of Exportation herein contained shall be subject to the proviso that the Governor may, by a written permit, allow the exportation of any goods or class of goods the exportation of which is otherwise prohibited.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the same country, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are prohibited, even in the cases where one only of the addresses is specifically mentioned.

\*NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is however, prepared, on application, to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants, in making enquiries, would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to His Majesty's Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

## DRAFT ORDINANCE.

*The following Draft Ordinance, about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Colonies for consideration, is published for general information :—*

## An Ordinance for the Protection of Illiterate Persons.

.....1917.

Enacted by the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Illiterates Protection Ordinance, 1917." Short title.

2. In this Ordinance "Document" means any print or writing capable of being used as evidence of any fact or thing as against the person by, for, or at the request, or on behalf, or in the name of whom the same purports to be written or signed in any way; Definitions.

An "Illiterate" means, in relation to any document, a person who is unable to read and understand the script or language in which the same is written or printed as the case may be.

3. No person shall write the name of an illiterate by way of signature to any document unless such illiterate shall have first appended his mark thereto; and any person who so writes the name of the illiterate shall also write on the document his own true and full name and address as witness and his so doing shall imply a statement that he wrote the name of the illiterate by way of signature after the illiterate had appended his mark and that he was instructed so to write by the illiterate and that prior to the illiterate appending his mark the document was read over and explained to the illiterate. Verification of signatures of illiterates.

4. Any person who shall write any document for or at the request, on behalf or in the name of any illiterate shall also write on such document his own true and full name as the writer thereof and his true and full address, and his so doing shall imply a statement that he was instructed to write such document by the person for whom it purports to have been written and that it fully and correctly represents his instructions and was read over and explained to him. Verification of letters written for illiterates.

5. If the writer of or witness to the signature on any such document shall fail to write thereon his true and full name and address as hereinbefore provided or if he has done so and the statement which under this Ordinance is implied thereby is untrue in any particular then and in every such case such person shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred and fifty rupees or in default of payment to imprisonment of either kind for a term not exceeding three months but without prejudice always to any criminal or civil liability which he may have incurred in the circumstances by reason of fraud, or forgery, or misrepresentation or otherwise. Penalty.
