PROCLAMATION.

1. I HEREBY CANCEL the first Schedule to the above-mentioned Ordinance (as amended by Proclamations dated respectively the 9th May, 1914, the 27th June, 1914, and the 25th March, 1915,) and substitute the following therefor, *viz.* :—

THE PREVENTION OF DISEASE (COTTON AND OTHER TRADES) ORDINANCE, 1916.

RULES.

THE PREVENTION OF DISEASE (COTTON AND OTHER TRADES) RULES, 1917.

1. THESE RULES may be cited as "The Prevention of Disease (Cotton and other Trades) Rules, 1917.

2. No seed cotton shall be shipped on to any vessel from the ports of Entebbe, Port Bell or Jinja.

3. No seed cotton shall be brought into the Protectorate from Kisumu, save that seed cotton the produce of this Protectorate may be brought in from Kisumu with the previous sanction in writing of the Governor and subject to such restrictions and conditions as he may impose.

4. No seed cotton shall be landed from any vessel at the port of Entebbe.

5. No seed cotton shall be landed from any vessel at Port Bell, save that up to the 31st December, 1917, seed cotton from Bukakata may be landed at Port Bell.

6. (1) No seed cotton from Mjanji shall be landed at any port in the Protectorate on Lake Victoria, save that up to the 31st December, 1917, such seed cotton may be landed at Jinja.

(2) No seed cotton shall be shipped on to any vessel from the port of Mjanji after the 31st December, 1917.

NOTICE.

*NOTE (1).—Under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, all Proclamations relating to Trading with the Enemy apply to all persons or bodies of persons of enemy nationality, resident or carrying on business in Persia, Morocco or Portuguese East Africa, and consequently it is an offence to trade with any person or body of

persons of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in Persia, Morocco or Portuguese East Africa, even though such person or body of persons is not included by name in the above list, and the omission of the name of any such person or body of persons from such list is not an authority or licence to trade with such person or body of persons.

NOTE (2).—Where a firm named in the List has more than one branch in the same country, all branches in that country are held to be included in the List, even in cases where no address, or of several addresses one only is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—The List for each country is sent by telegraph to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who will notify British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List; but firms in the United Kingdom with branches abroad are advised to furnish such branches with copies of the Statutory List. The Lists for all countries in Central and South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington.

The Foreign Trade Department is prepared, on application, to inquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of substitutes for any firm on the Statutory List. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he must undertake to pay the cost of the telegraphic correspondence. A considerable amount of information is, however, already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is hoped that it may be possible in many cases to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes in response to inquiries, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. It would greatly facilitate the work of this Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade, or trades, for which substitutes are required.

| Short title. | 1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Land Acquisition Ordinance, 1917." |
| Interpretation. | 2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires,
"For public purposes" shall mean for exclusive Government use or for general public use or for providing, increasing or improving means of access to any land. |
| Power of Governor to acquire land. | 3. It shall be lawful for the Governor in the exercise of his discretion to take and acquire any land required for public purposes and to pay as a consideration or compensation therefor such sum of money as may be agreed upon or determined by the High Court under the provisions of this Ordinance. |
| Notice of intention to take land. | 4. (1) Whenever the Governor resolves that any land is required for public purposes, the Land Officer shall give notice thereof, which notice may be in the Form in the Schedule, to all persons appearing by any register kept pursuant to the provisions of any Ordinance dealing with the registration of land or the titles thereto to have any interest in the said land or to the persons entitled by this Ordinance to sell and convey or transfer the same, or to such of the said persons as shall after reasonable enquiry be known to him and to such other persons as he may think proper; and by such notice shall demand from such persons the particulars and evidence of their estate and interest in such land and of the claims made by them in respect thereof; and every such notice shall state the particulars of the land so required, and that the Land Officer is willing to treat for the acquisition thereof.

(2) The publication in the <i>Gazette</i> of any such Notice shall be conclusive evidence that the land therein described is required for public purposes. |

5. It shall be lawful for all persons being seized, possessed of or entitled to any land or any estate or interest therein, to sell and convey or transfer the same to the Governor, and particularly it shall be lawful for all or any of the following persons to sell and convey or transfer, that is to say—all guardians, committees of lunatics, trustees for charitable or other purposes, executors and administrators, and all persons for the time being entitled to the receipt of the rents and profits of any such land; and the power so to sell and convey or transfer as aforesaid may lawfully be exercised by such persons not only on behalf of themselves and their respective heirs, executors, administrators and successors, but also for and on behalf of every person entitled in reversion or remainder after them or in defeasance of their estates, and as to such guardians on behalf of their wards, and as to such committees on behalf of the lunatics of whom they are the committees respectively to the same extent as such wards and lunatics could have exercised the same powers under the authority of this Ordinance if they had respectively been under no disability, and as to such trustees, executors and administrators on behalf of their *cestuis que trust* respectively to the same extent as such *cestuis que trust* could have exercised the same powers under the authority of this Ordinance if they had respectively been under no disability.

Power of persons under disability to sell and convey.

6. The Land Officer may by such notice aforesaid or by any subsequent notice direct the persons aforesaid to yield up possession of such land after the expiration of the period specified in the notice, which period shall not be less than twenty-one days from service of such notice, and at the expiration of such period the Governor and any person authorized by him shall be entitled to enter into and take possession of such land accordingly.

Notice of intention to take; and power to take possession.

7. (1) All notices under sections four and six shall either be served personally or by post on the persons holding any estate or interest in any land named in such notice, or enabled by this Ordinance to sell and convey or transfer the same, or left at their last usual place of abode or business, if any such place can after reasonable enquiry be found, and in case any such parties shall be absent from the Protectorate, or if such parties or their last usual place of abode or business after reasonable enquiry cannot be found such notice shall be left with the occupier of such land, or if there be no such occupier shall be affixed upon some conspicuous part of such land.

Service of notices.

(2) If any such person be a corporation, such notice shall be left at the principal office of such corporation in the Protectorate, or, if no such office can after reasonable enquiry be found, shall be served personally or by post upon some officer (if any) or agent (if any) of such corporation in the Protectorate.

(3) Copies of all notices served under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be posted outside the office of the District Commissioner of the district wherein such land is situated, and all such notices shall be inserted once at least in the *Gazette*.

Power to take
by agreement.

8. It shall be lawful for the Land Officer to treat with the owners or occupiers or any other person holding any estate or interest in any land required for public purposes, or enabled by this Ordinance to sell and convey or transfer the same, as regards the consideration or compensation to be paid either in respect of the estate or interest to be acquired or in respect of any damages or loss incurred by reason of the exercise of any of the powers conferred upon the Governor by this Ordinance.

Disputes as to
compensation
and title.

9. If for twenty-one days after the service and publication of such notice as aforesaid, any person shall fail to send to the Land Officer particulars of his claim in respect of any such land; or if any person who has so sent particulars of his claim and the Land Officer shall not agree as to the consideration or compensation to be paid by the Governor in respect of the estate or interest in such land belonging to such person or which he is by this Ordinance enabled to sell and convey or transfer, or in respect of any damages sustained by reason of the exercise of any of the powers conferred by this Ordinance; or if such person has not given satisfactory evidence in support of his claim; or if separate and conflicting claims are made in respect of the same land; the amount of consideration (if any) or compensation (if any) and any such case of disputed interest or title shall be settled in the manner hereinafter provided.

Disputes to be

10. (1) The High Court shall have jurisdiction to hear and determine in all cases mentioned in the last preceding section upon a summons taken out by the Attorney-General or any person holding or claiming any estate or interest in any land named in any notice aforesaid, or enabled or claiming to be enabled by this Ordinance to sell and convey or transfer the same.

(2) By its judgment in any such proceedings the Court may order the conveyance or transfer to the Governor of any land or any estate or interest therein by the persons entitled thereto.

11. Where any person upon whom a summons has been served shall not appear at the time appointed, a decision may be given *ex parte* upon hearing the evidence adduced; and such decision shall be as effectual as if given after hearing and in the presence of such person.

12. (1) The written report of the Land Officer or of any Government surveyor or of any officer of the Public Works Department or any Railway officer in the service of the Government of the Protectorate or of the East Africa Protectorate as to the value of the land or of any buildings thereon shall be evidence thereof; provided that any party having an interest in such land may call such surveyor or other officer as a witness.

(2) The report of such surveyor or other officer may be proved by a copy thereof certified by his signature.

(3) Proof of the signature on any such report or copy shall not be required, unless the Court sees reason to doubt the genuineness thereof.

13. No party shall at any time be required to sell or convey or transfer to the Governor a part only of any house or other building if such party be willing and able to sell and convey or transfer the whole thereof.

14. Where the Governor has in pursuance of a notice under section six entered into possession of any land, the Court may award compensation to the owners of such land and all parties entitled to any estate or interest therein for loss of rents and mesne profits for the period between the time when the Governor so entered into possession, and the time when the purchase money due under an agreement has been paid to the person entitled thereto, or compensation has been paid into Court under the provisions of this Ordinance.

Compensation for loss of rents and profits.

15. In estimating the compensation to be given for any land or any estate or interest therein or for any mesne profits thereof the Court shall assess the same according to what it shall find to have been the value of such land, estate or interest or profits at the time when the Land Officer served notices to acquire the same, and without regard to any improvements or works made or constructed thereafter on the said land.

Compensation to be assessed according to value at time of service of notices.

16. Where part only of the land belonging to any person is taken under this Ordinance, the Court may in assessing the consideration or compensation for the land so taken, take into consideration any enhancement of the value of the residue of the land by reason of the proximity of any improvements or works made or constructed or to be made or constructed by the Government.

Power of Court where value of residue of land enhanced.

17. In estimating the consideration or compensation to be given by the Governor, regard shall be had by the Court not only to the value of the land required for public purposes but also to the damage, if any, to be sustained by the owner by reason of the severance of such land from other land belonging to such owner or other injurious affecting of such other land by the exercise of the powers conferred by this Ordinance.

Estimation of consideration and compensation.

18. If any land required for public purposes, not being situate in a township or built upon, shall be so cut through and divided by the land taken as to leave either on both sides or on one side thereof a piece of land of less quantity than half an acre, and if the owner of the land so left require the Governor to take the same along with the other land required for public purposes, the Governor shall take the same accordingly, unless the owner thereof have other land adjoining thereto into which the same can be thrown, so as to be conveniently occupied therewith.

Owners of intersected land may insist on same being taken.

19. In any proceedings under this Ordinance, the Court may make such order as to costs as to it shall seem fit.

Costs.

Provided that where the amount awarded by the Court as the consideration or compensation due to the owner of any estate or interest in any land taken for public purposes does not exceed the sum offered by the Land Officer to such person as consideration or compensation for such estate or interest, such person shall pay the costs of all proceedings under section ten rendered necessary by the action of such person for the determination of the amount to be awarded.

20. The decision of the Court respecting any consideration or compensation or any question of disputed interest or title shall be final and conclusive as regards all parties upon whom summonses have been

Decision of Court final as respects parties summoned, etc.

served as aforesaid, or who have appeared and claimed, or on whose behalf any person, having authority to that effect, has claimed any land or any interest therein, but it shall be lawful for any person upon whom a summons has not been served, and who has not appeared or claimed, and on whose behalf no claim has been made as aforesaid, to make to the Land Officer within one year after the date of the publication in the *Gazette* of the Notice mentioned in section four a claim for consideration or compensation against the Governor in respect of any estate or interest such person may have in any such land.

If any person so claiming and the Land Officer shall not agree as to the said claim, proceedings in respect thereof may be had in the manner provided in section ten and the provisions of the subsequent sections shall so far as may be apply thereto.

Government exempt from double payment.

Provided that in no case shall the Government be liable to pay consideration or compensation to any such person in respect of any estate or interest for which it has already paid consideration or compensation to any other person, but such first mentioned person, if he has a better right to such consideration or compensation, may recover the same from the person to whom it has been paid.

Governor exonerated upon payment.

21. The payment to and receipt of any person to whom any consideration or compensation shall be paid or the payment into Court of any consideration or compensation upon a decision of the Court under the provisions of this Ordinance shall effectually discharge the Governor from seeing to the application or being answerable for the misapplication thereof, provided always that where any person is in possession in virtue of any estate less than an estate of inheritance, or where any person is in possession in any fiduciary or representative character, the Governor may make payment of such consideration or compensation to such persons and in such proportion and instalments and after such notices as the Court may direct.

Agreement with person specially benefited to bear cost or construct works to be binding.

22. The Governor may enter into an agreement with any person who will be specially benefited by the exercise of the Governor's rights under this Ordinance whereby such person shall agree to pay the whole or any part of the expenses incurred by the Governor in connection with the acquisition of any land under this Ordinance and to carry out any works upon such land when acquired, and the fact that any such special benefit will accrue shall be sufficient consideration to make any such agreement binding upon such person.

Power to enter land to make survey.

23. The Governor and any persons authorized by him at any time may enter upon any land for the purpose of surveying the same or boring to ascertain the nature of the soil or for other purposes of the like nature. The owner or occupier shall be entitled to compensation for actual damage (if any) occasioned in the course of such operations.

Penalty for hindering the taking possession of land.

24. Every person who shall wilfully hinder or obstruct the Governor or any person authorized by him in or from entering upon or taking possession of or using any land in pursuance of the provisions of this

Ordinance, or shall molest, hinder or obstruct him or them when in possession of such land, shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding Rupees three hundred or to imprisonment of either description for any term not exceeding three months or to both.

25. In addition to the questions to be decided by the Court, every summons taken out by the Attorney-General under section ten shall state the amount of the consideration or compensation which the Governor is willing to pay for the land to which the summons relates, and when part only of the land belonging to any person is required such summons shall also state the sum, if any, allowed in estimating such amount, for enhancement of the value of the residue of such land.

Consideration which the Governor is willing to pay, and sum, if any, allowed for enhancement to be stated in summons.

26. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed so as to abrogate, prejudice or detract from the rights of the Governor under the Uganda Agreement, 1900, or under the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1903.

Rights under the Uganda Agreement, 1900, and Ordinance No. 2 of 1903 saved.

27. Upon the commencement of this Ordinance the following enactment of the Governor-General of India in Council shall cease to apply to the Protectorate, viz. :—

A document must be presented for registration either by a person executing or claiming an interest under the same, or the agent of such person, and the Registrar may require to be satisfied as to the identity of the person by whom it is brought, or, in the case of an agent, as to his authority. |
| Registration how effected. | 5. Registration shall consist in the filing of a copy (to be furnished by the person presenting the document for registration) of the document brought for registration after such copy has been certified by the Registrar as a true copy. |

| Refusal to register where rules not complied with or document unsuitable. | 9. Where the size, shape or quality of the paper or other material on which copies of documents presented for registration shall be made or the manner in which they shall be made is prescribed by rule made under |

this Ordinance, the Registrar may refuse to register any document which does not comply therewith; and where such matters are not prescribed by rule the Registrar may refuse registration of any document whereof the copy presented for registration is not in his opinion suitable for filing.

10. The Registrar may refuse to register any document which contains any seditious, libellous, scandalous or indecent matter.

Refusal to register when document contains seditious, etc matter.

11. If any document presented for registration is not in the English language, it must be accompanied by a translation in English duly certified to the satisfaction of the Registrar and also by a true copy of the original document.

Documents in foreign language.

12. The Registrar may in his discretion refuse to accept for registration any document in which any interlineation, blank, erasure or alteration appears, unless the persons executing the document affix their signatures or initials to such interlineation, blank, erasure or alteration. If he registers such document he shall at the time of registering the same make a note in the Register of such interlineation, blank, erasure or alteration.

Documents containing interlineations, blanks, erasures or alterations.

13. Where any person alleges that any error or omission has been made in the Register or that any entry or omission therein has been procured by fraud or mistake the Registrar shall, if he shall consider such allegation satisfactorily proved, correct such error, omission or entry as aforesaid.

Power of Registrar to correct errors and omissions.

14. Registration shall not cure any defect in any document registered or confer upon it any effect or validity which it would not otherwise have had, except in so far as provided in this Ordinance.

Registration not to cure defect or confer validity.

15. The Register may be searched and examined by any applicant during the usual office hours, and certified copies of any entry may be obtained if required; but no document filed in the Register shall be permitted to be taken therefrom.

Registers may be searched.

16. In the event of the loss or destruction of any document registered under this Ordinance a copy certified to be a true copy under the hand of the Registrar shall be admissible in evidence of its contents in all Courts in the Protectorate subject to all just and lawful exceptions.

Where document lost or destroyed certified copy may be admitted in evidence of its contents.

17. Every certified copy or extract of any registered document purporting to be signed by the Registrar, shall be receivable in evidence in any civil case without further or other proof thereof unless it is alleged to be a forgery. The party proposing to use it in evidence shall deliver a copy of such certified copy or extract to the opposite party, and such copy or extract shall be received in evidence if the Court is of opinion that the

Certified copy or extract of registered document admissible in civil cases.

copy thereof was delivered in sufficient time before the hearing to enable the opposite party to inspect the original Register from which the copy or extract has been taken.

Non-liability
of Registrar.

18. The Registrar shall not be liable to any suit, claim or demand by reason of anything done or omitted to be done by him in good faith in his official capacity.

Fees.

19. The fees prescribed in the Schedule shall be payable for the matters to which they relate; provided that such fees may be altered or added to or a new Schedule substituted by rule made under the next succeeding section.

Governor's
power to make
rules.

20. The Governor may make rules for carrying out the purposes and provisions of this Ordinance. Such rules may provide a penalty not exceeding one hundred rupees for any breach thereof.

Repeal

21. (1) The Uganda Registration of Documents Ordinance, 1904, the Uganda Registration of Documents (Amendment) Ordinance, 1904, and the Uganda Registration of Documents (Amendment) Ordinance, 1905, are hereby repealed but without prejudice always to anything lawfully done thereunder or the prosecution of any offence committed before the commencement of this Ordinance.

Preservation of
old registers.

(2) All registers kept under the said Uganda Registration of Documents Ordinance, 1904, shall be delivered into the custody of the Registrar under this Ordinance and preserved by him and shall be open to inspection in the same manner as the register kept under this Ordinance and a certified copy of any document registered therein may be furnished by the Registrar in the same manner as a certified copy of a document registered under this Ordinance.
