An Ordinance relating to Diseases of Animals.

[1ST JANUARY, 1918.]

Enacted by the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate.

PART I.—PRELIMINARY.

Short title
and com-
mencement.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1917," and shall come into force on the first day of January, 1918.

Interpretation.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires,

"Animals" means all stock, camels and other ruminating animals, and dogs; but does not include any other animal, except such as may be declared by the Governor by Notice published in the *Gazette* to be included in the term "animals" for the purposes of this Ordinance.

"Carcase" means the carcase of an animal and includes part of a carcase and the meat, bones, hide, skin, hoofs, horns, offal or other part of an animal separately or otherwise or any portion thereof.

"Cattle" means bulls, cows, oxen, heifers and calves.

"Disease" means cattle plague (rinderpest), anthrax, pleuro-pneumonia, trypanosomiasis, tuberculosis, foot and mouth disease, rabies, sheep-pox, sheep scab, goat scab, goat-pox, swine fever, swine erysipelas, glanders, farcy, mange (scabies) in horses, mules and donkeys, dourine, ulcerative lymphangitis, and epizootic lymphangitis; but does not include any other disease, except such as may be declared by the Governor by Notice published in the *Official Gazette* to be included in the term "disease" for the purposes of this Ordinance.

"Fodder" means hay or other substance commonly used for food of animals.

"Litter" means straw or other substance commonly used for bedding or otherwise for or about animals.

"Stock" means cattle, sheep, goats, horses, mules, donkeys, swine and poultry.

PART II.—STEPS FOR CHECKING DISEASE.

3. Every person having in his possession or charge any animal affected with disease or suspected of being affected with disease shall as soon as possible :—

Diseased animals to be separated and notified.

(a.) keep such animal separate from animals not so affected or suspected of being so affected;

(b.) cause such animal to be tied up or put in a kraal or other enclosed place;

and (c.) notify the nearest Administrative Officer of the fact of the animal being affected or suspected of being affected.

4. Any Administrative Officer who is notified of any animal being affected or suspected of being affected with disease shall forthwith notify the nearest Veterinary Officer who shall give such directions and take such steps as may be necessary for the purpose of ascertaining the existence and nature of the disease and he shall on being satisfied that such disease exists forthwith report to the Chief Veterinary Officer.

Notification to be forwarded to Veterinary Officer.

5. An Administrative Officer in charge of a district shall, on being satisfied as to the existence within his district of a disease affecting stock, forthwith cause all owners and occupiers of farms and owners of stock in the neighbourhood to be notified thereof.

Farmers to be notified of outbreak.

6. Any Administrative Officer or Veterinary Officer may cause to be slaughtered any animal affected or suspected of being affected with any disease or any animal which has been in contact with a diseased animal or has been otherwise exposed to the infection or contagion of disease.

Slaughter.

7. Where an animal has been slaughtered under this Ordinance or any rule, order or direction thereunder its carcase shall belong to the Government and shall be buried or sold or otherwise disposed of under such conditions as an Administrative or Veterinary Officer may think fit and any proceeds of sale shall be paid into the Treasury and form part of the public revenue of the Protectorate.

Carcases to belong to Government.

PART III.—POWERS OF OFFICERS.

8. Where an animal dies of disease any Administrative Officer, Veterinary Officer, or Stock Inspector may give directions with reference to the burial, destruction or disposal of the carcase, hide, skin, hair wool, litter, dung or fodder.

Burial, etc., of carcasses, etc., of diseased animals.

9. Any Veterinary Officer may at any time require any animal to be inoculated, sprayed, dipped, washed or otherwise disinfected or to undergo a period of quarantine if he should consider the same to be necessary in order to prevent the spread of disease.

Power of inoculation, disinfection, etc.

10. Any Veterinary Officer may, for the purpose of detecting or diagnosing disease take or cause to be taken from any animal blood smears, or apply such other tests as he may consider necessary.

Power to carry out tests.

Power to prohibit exhibitions, etc.

11. The Chief Veterinary Officer may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of any disease, prohibit in any place the holding of any exhibition of stock, or the sale of stock in open markets or in private sale yards.

Power to restrict slaughter.

12. The Chief Veterinary Officer may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of disease, prohibit in any place the slaughter of cattle for food and the sale of meat or carcasses or of any part thereof.

Powers of entry.

13. Any Administrative Officer, Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector may enter any lands, building, shed, place, carriage, van or truck containing, or suspected to contain or used for the purpose of containing or carrying animals, carcasses, hides, skins, hair, wool, litter, dung or fodder and may examine the same and any animals, carcasses, hides, skins, hair, wool, litter, dung or fodder found therein for the purpose of ascertaining whether any such animal is suffering from any disease or whether any such animal, carcase, hide, skin, hair, wool, litter, dung or fodder is capable of transmitting any disease or for the purpose of ascertaining whether any rules, orders or directions in respect to the cleansing and disinfection of such building, shed, place, carriage, van or truck made or given under this Ordinance have been properly carried out.

Power to inspect.

14. The owner or person in charge of any animals, carcasses, hides, skins, hair, wool, litter, dung or fodder shall produce the same for inspection when called on to do so by any Administrative Officer, Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector.

Power to carry out requirements.

15. Where any person is required by this Ordinance or by any rule, order or direction lawfully made or given thereunder to do any act or thing and fails to comply with such requirement, any Administrative Officer, Veterinary Officer, Stock Inspector or Police Officer may cause the same to be done at the expense of such person so failing.

PART IV.—COMPENSATION.

Compensation to be paid for slaughter.

16. Subject to the provisions of the next succeeding section, compensation for animals slaughtered under this Ordinance shall be paid to the owner as follows:—where the animal was affected with disease, one half of its value (to be fixed by a Veterinary Officer) immediately before it became so affected, but so that the compensation shall not exceed in the case of horses three hundred rupees, in the case of mules two hundred rupees, in the case of donkeys and camels one hundred rupees and in the case of other animals fifty rupees, and where the animal was not known to be so affected its value (to be fixed by a Veterinary Officer) immediately before it was slaughtered but so that the compensation shall not exceed in the case of horses six hundred rupees, in the case of mules four hundred rupees, in the case of donkeys and camels two hundred rupees and in the case of other animals one hundred rupees.

17. Compensation in respect of any animal slaughtered under this Ordinance may be wholly or partially withheld where the owner or person in charge of the animal has been guilty of any breach of this Ordinance or of any rule, order or direction made or given thereunder and no compensation shall be payable in respect of any animal slaughtered if such animal was affected with disease when imported into the Protectorate or became affected before it was passed by the Inspecting Officer (if any) at the port or place of entry into the Protectorate or if such animal was imported into the Protectorate in breach of this Ordinance or of any rule, order or direction made or given thereunder.

Cases where compensation may be withheld.

PART V.—INFECTED AREAS.

18. The Governor may at any time, by Notice published in the *Gazette*, declare any area within the Protectorate to be an infected area for the purposes of this Ordinance.

Governor may declare infected areas.

19. The following provisions shall, in the absence of other provisions made by rules under this Ordinance, apply to all infected areas, *viz.* :—

Rules for infected areas.

- (1.) No stock shall be moved from any such area without the written permission of the Chief Veterinary Officer or the Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector in charge of such area.
- (2.) No other animal shall be moved from any such area unless previously disinfected in the manner directed by the Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector in charge of the area.
- (3.) All stock in such area shall be herded as far as possible from any public road.
- (4.) The Chief Veterinary Officer or the Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector in charge of such area may require the owner or person in charge of any animal or animals within such area to isolate such animal or animals from other animals within the infected area or to remove such animal or animals from the infected area to such other place as he may direct within a stated period.
- (5.) The Chief Veterinary Officer or the Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector in charge of such area may cause any animal therein to be branded with such mark as he may think fit.
- (6.) No person shall leave any such area without having complied with such precautions for preventing the spread of disease as may be required by the Veterinary Officer or Stock Inspector in charge of the area.
- (7.) The carcasses of all animals dying from disease shall forthwith be either buried at a depth of not less than four feet below the surface of the ground or burnt at the expense of the owner.

20. Any person negligently allowing an animal to escape from an infected area shall be deemed, for the purposes of the last preceding section, to have moved such animal from such area.

Negligently allowing escape from infected area.

PART VI.—RULES.

Governor may
make rules.

21. The Governor may make rules for the prevention of the introduction into and spread of disease in or from the Protectorate and generally for the carrying out of the purposes and provisions of this Ordinance.

Some purposes
for which rules
may be made
specified.

22. The rules made under the last preceding section may include amongst other matters rules for all or any of the following purposes, *viz.* :—

- (1.) The control, detention, custody, isolation, inoculation, disinfection, removal or slaughter of animals suffering or suspected to be suffering from any disease or of any animals exposed to infection or of any animals or any particular species of animals especially liable to become infected with any disease.
- (2.) The burial, destruction or disposal of carcasses.
- (3.) Prescribing ports and places for the importation into or the exportation from the Protectorate of animals, carcasses, hides, skins, hair, wool, litter, dung or fodder.
- (4.) Prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals, carcasses, hides, skins, hair, wool, litter, dung or fodder within the Protectorate.
- (5.) Prescribing quarantine for imported animals or diseased animals or animals suspected of disease or animals which have been in contact with animals suffering from disease, or for animals or any particular species of animals especially liable to become infected with disease.
- (6.) Prohibiting or regulating the importation into or the exportation from the Protectorate of animals, carcasses, hides, skins, hair, wool, litter, dung or fodder and prescribing the conditions under which such importation or exportation may take place.
- (7.) Prescribing the cleansing and disinfection of buildings and places wherein animals have been stalled or kept.
- (8.) Prescribing the cleansing and disinfection of public markets, private auction or sale yards, railway premises, railway vans, trucks or carriages wherein any animal shall have been placed, kept or carried.
- (9.) Providing for the periodical dipping of animals.
- (10.) Prescribing the disinfection of persons and their clothing and personal effects coming into contact with or employed about animals suffering or suspected to be suffering from disease or being in an infected area.
- (11.) Prohibiting or regulating the movement of vehicles into, through or out of areas in which tse-tse flies (*glossinae*) are known to exist.
- (12.) Prescribing fees and charges for the examination, inoculation, testing, disinfecting or slaughter of animals and for the feeding and stabling of animals detained in quarantine and providing generally for the payment and recovery of expenses incurred by the Government under this Ordinance.

Nothing in this section shall limit or shall be construed so as to limit the powers conferred upon the Governor by the last preceding section. Saving.

PART VII.—LEGAL PROCEEDINGS AND PENALTIES.

23. No action shall lie against the Government or any Officer thereof for any act done in good faith under the provisions of this Ordinance or of any rule, order or direction made or given thereunder, and, save as hereinbefore provided, no compensation shall be payable to any person for any act done under this Ordinance, unless the Governor otherwise directs. Saving of acts done under Ordinance.

24. Any person obstructing or impeding or assisting to obstruct or impede a person in the lawful exercise of his duties under this Ordinance shall be guilty of an offence under this Ordinance and may be arrested without warrant by a Police Officer. Obstruction.

25. Any person improperly altering a permit given under this Ordinance or under any rules made thereunder shall be guilty of an offence under this Ordinance. Improperly altering permits.

26. Any person guilty of an offence under this Ordinance or committing any breach thereof or of any rule made thereunder or failing to comply with any rule, order or direction lawfully made or given thereunder shall be liable to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding twelve months or to a fine not exceeding three thousand rupees or to both. Penalties.

27. Where a person is seen or found committing or is suspected of being engaged in committing an offence or breach as described in section twenty-six, an Administrative, Veterinary or Police Officer or Stock Inspector may, without warrant, stop and detain him; and if his name and address are not known to such Official and he fails to give them to the satisfaction of the Official, the Official may, without warrant, arrest him provided that where the Official arresting is not a Police Officer he shall without unnecessary delay make over the offender to a Police Officer or in the absence of a Police Officer, take the offender to the nearest Police Station. Detention and arrest.

28. (1) An Administrative, Veterinary or Police Officer or Stock Inspector may seize and examine any animal, carcase, hide, skin, vehicle, boat or thing with regard to which he suspects that any such offence or breach as aforesaid has been or is being committed and may order the same to be taken back forthwith to or into any area or place wherefrom it may be suspected to have been unlawfully removed or he may remove the same to any pound, enclosure or other place selected by a Veterinary Officer and there detain the same subject to the orders of a magistrate. Seizure of animals, etc.

(2) Any seizure and detention made under this section shall with all practicable speed be reported by the Official making the same to a magistrate having jurisdiction in the district within which the seizure has been made.

Forfeiture on conviction.

29. (1) Whenever any person shall have been convicted of an offence or breach as aforesaid the Court convicting such person may in addition to or in lieu of imposing any other punishment authorised by law order that the animals or things or any of them in respect of which such offence or breach has been committed shall be forfeited.

Forfeiture when offender not found.

(2) Whenever it shall be reported to a magistrate that any animal or thing has been seized and detained under section twenty-eight but that the person who is alleged to have committed an offence or breach in respect of such animal or thing is unknown or cannot be found, the magistrate may if satisfied by evidence on oath that there is reason to believe that such offence or breach has been committed order such animal or thing to be forfeited. Provided however that no order shall be made unless the owner (if his name and whereabouts be known) of such animal or thing shall have had an opportunity of appearing before the magistrate to show cause why such order should not be made.

Recovery of expenses.

(3) A magistrate whenever he shall be satisfied that there is reason to believe that an offence or breach as aforesaid has been committed in respect of any animal or thing seized and detained under section twenty-eight may order that the owner thereof shall pay to the Chief Veterinary Officer such sum as he may consider reasonable to cover the expenses connected with the removal of such animal or thing to the place of detention and (in the case of an animal) the cost of its keep during such detention and that unless such sum be paid within a time to be specified in such order the animal or thing shall be forfeited.

Forfeited property, how dealt with.

(4) Whenever any animal or thing is forfeited under the provisions of this Ordinance it shall be slaughtered, sold or otherwise dealt with as the Governor may by any general or special order direct and the proceeds of sale if any shall form part of the Revenue of the Protectorate.

Powers of Police saved.

30. Nothing in the last three preceding sections shall take away or abridge any power or authority that a Police Officer would have had if the said sections had not been enacted.

PART VIII.—REPEAL.

Nos. 6 of 1902, 1 of 1913, and 13 of 1913, repealed.

31. The Ordinances set out in the Schedule are hereby repealed but without prejudice always to anything lawfully done thereunder or to any proceedings pending at the date of the commencement of this Ordinance or to the prosecution of any offence committed before such date.

THE UGANDA AGREEMENT, 1900,

THE UGANDA AGREEMENT (JUDICIAL), 1905,

AND

THE COURTS ORDINANCE, 1911.

PROCLAMATION.

NATIVE COURTS IN BUGANDA.

WHEREAS it is expedient and has been agreed by His Highness the Kabaka and the Chiefs and People of Buganda that the provisions of the Proclamation of the 15th day of January, 1909, and any amendments thereof with regard to Native Courts in Buganda should be amended in certain particulars:—

NOW THEREFORE I, HENRY RICHARD WALLIS, Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of Uganda, by virtue of the said Agreement and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me in that behalf hereby DECLARE AND PROCLAIM THAT—

1. (a) The following Native Courts have been established in Buganda with powers and jurisdiction following, that is to say:—

A. THE COURT OF THE LUKIKO, consisting of a committee of any seven or more members of the Lukiko as constituted by The Uganda Agreement, 1900, who are of or above the rank of Gombolola Chief, presided over by the Kabaka or by one of their number who shall be the Mulamuzi or in his absence the Katikiro or Mwanika, with full jurisdiction in Buganda (original, appellate and revisional), except as hereinafter provided, in all cases in which all parties are natives of the Protectorate.

B. THE COURTS OF THE ABAMASAZA as set forth in the Schedule hereto, presided over by the Saza Chief of the County, or his Deputy (Mubaka); or failing them, by a person (Musigire) appointed by the Saza Chief, who must not be of less rank than a

Muluka Chief in the Saza sitting with any two or more of the following Sub-Chiefs of the Saza, namely the Mumyuka, the Sabadu, the Sabagabo, the Sabawali, the Musale, the Mutuba (one or more) or their Deputies (Babaka); or failing them, any two or more of the elders of the Saza, with jurisdiction in the Saza, except as hereinafter provided, to hear and decide the cases following and to revise the proceedings of the Courts of the Sub-Chiefs:—

- (I.) All cases in which a native of the Protectorate is accused of an offence, except when the complainant is a non-native of the Protectorate; provided always that a greater punishment than one year's rigorous imprisonment, or fine of Rs. 75/-, or whipping of 24 lashes, shall not be imposed by a Saza Court.
- (II.) All cases between natives of the Protectorate in which the amount or value of the subject matter in dispute does not exceed Rs. 250/-.
- (III.) Appeals from the Courts of the Sub-Chiefs.

C. THE COURTS OF THE SUB-CHIEFS as set forth in the Schedule hereto, each presided over by the Sub-Chief or his Deputy (Mubaka); or failing them, by a person (Musigire) appointed by the Sub-Chief, who must not be of less rank than a Muluka Chief in the Gombolola sitting with any two or more of the following officials of the Sub-Chief, namely the Mumyuka, the Sabadu, the Sabagabo, the Sabawali, the Musale, the Mutuba (one or more) or their Deputies (Babaka); or failing them, any two or more of the elders of the district of the Sub-Chief, with jurisdiction in the administrative district of the Sub-Chief, except as hereinafter mentioned, to hear and decide:—

- (I.) All cases in which a native of the Protectorate is accused of an offence, except when the complainant is a non-native of the Protectorate, provided always that a greater punishment than three months' rigorous imprisonment, or fine of Rs. 30/-, or whipping of ten lashes, shall not be imposed by any such Court.
- (II.) All cases between natives of the Protectorate in which the amount or value of the subject matter in dispute does not exceed Rs. 75/-.
- (b) "Native of the Protectorate" includes any native of any tribe on the confines of the Protectorate, who has been resident in the Protectorate for a period of at least one year, and also includes any Sudanese or Nubian, without any restriction as to period of residence.

(c) For the purpose of record the said Courts shall make such returns to the Court under whose supervision they are, as may be directed by such Court or prescribed by Rule.

(d) The said Courts shall conform with such procedure, practice and rules as may be from time to time specially or generally prescribed by the High Court and until any such procedure, practice or rules have been prescribed each of the said Courts shall exercise its jurisdiction according to the procedure and practice heretofore followed by it, subject to any directions which the Native or British Supervisory Court may from time to time give.

(e) The said Courts shall not issue process to compel the appearance of any person over whom they have no jurisdiction, but should the evidence of such a person be required by any of the said Courts which it is unable to secure without the issue of process, it

shall report the matter to the Court under whose supervision it is, and that Court may either (I.) issue process to compel the appearance of the witness before the said Court, or (II.) make such orders either to take evidence before itself or on commission, as may be necessary to secure its production before the said Court, or (III.) transfer the case for hearing or enquiry before the appropriate British Court.

2. The following cases shall be tried by British Courts, under and subject to the provisions of The Courts Ordinance, 1911; provided always that any such Court may refer any such case which it has jurisdiction to try for hearing by a Native Court where all the parties are natives of Buganda:—

- (1) All cases in which a person is charged with an offence in consequence of which death has resulted.
- (2) All offences committed in any place declared to be a Township, provided that as regards any Township or part of a Township the Governor may direct that the Native Courts shall have jurisdiction to try such offences.
- (3) Civil and Criminal cases in which the accused, the complainant or any of the parties, are regularly employed in Government service or are Sudanese or Nubians.
- (4) All breaches, which are punishable as offences, of any special law (*e.g.*, Arms, Game, Forest, Fiscal, Mining, etc.), provided however that the Native Courts shall have concurrent jurisdiction without the reference aforesaid in cases relating to Poll Tax or Gun Tax, where the accused is a native of the Protectorate, other than a Sudanese or Nubian.
- (5) Any case which has been ordered to be tried by a British Court under paragraph 1 (*e*) or 4 (*a*) hereof or which may be transferred for hearing to a British Court by the Lukiko at the request of a Native or British Court.

EXPLANATION: Natives of the Gulu, Chua and West Nile Districts are not included in the expression "Sudanese or Nubians."

3. The High Court shall hear and decide all causes in Buganda between natives of the Protectorate of a like nature to the causes which would come before the said Court in the exercise of its jurisdiction under The Divorce Ordinance, 1904, or under Section 19 of The Uganda Muhammadan Marriage and Divorce Ordinance, 1906.

4. The following British Courts shall have the below-mentioned powers of supervision over Native Courts, which shall be exercised in accordance with the provisions of The Courts Ordinance, 1911.

(a) A District Commissioner, or at his request, subject to any direction of the High Court, any other Magistrate having jurisdiction in the district shall exercise the following powers of supervision over the Native Courts, other than the Lukiko:—

- (1) Power to call for records or to make any enquiry as to proceedings.
- (2) Power to stay all proceedings where they appear illegal or improper, or where the sentence is excessive or inhumane.
- (3) Power to direct the re-hearing of any case by the Court whose proceedings are being supervised, or to refer the case for revision to the next highest Native Court.

(4) Power, in any case in which it appears that the Court of the Lukiko, Saza or Sub-Chief has no jurisdiction, to annul the proceedings and refer the case for hearing to a Court having jurisdiction.

(5) Power in any particular case, in which the accused, the complainant or any of the parties are not natives of Buganda if, for reasons to be recorded, he considers it advisable so to do, to transfer the case for trial before himself or some other British Court having jurisdiction, and, if the case has been tried, to revise the proceedings of the Native Court.

(b) The Provincial Commissioner, or in his absence the District Commissioner, or any other Magistrate at the request of the Provincial Commissioner shall have power:—

(1) To revise the proceedings of the Court of the Lukiko.

(2) In any particular case in which the accused, the complainant or any of the parties are not natives of Buganda, to order the case to be tried by a British Court.

(c) The High Court shall have power:—

(1) If for any special reason it considers it advisable so to do, to exercise any of the powers vested in the Provincial Commissioner or a District Commissioner, under this Proclamation, and

(2) To revise any of the proceedings of any of the British Courts having jurisdiction hereunder.

(3) In cases in which the accused, the complainant or any of the parties are not natives of Buganda to direct that any case or class of cases triable by the Lukiko be tried by a British Court.

5. In any original case, civil or criminal, tried before the Lukiko in which the accused, the complainant or any of the parties are not natives of Buganda there shall be an appeal from the Lukiko to the High Court.

6. Except as otherwise stated in this Proclamation, nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the jurisdiction of the High Court in "mixed cases" (that is cases between Natives of Buganda and non-Natives of Buganda), or on appeal or the transfer of cases to the High Court as provided by The Uganda Agreement, 1900, or The Uganda Agreement (Judicial), 1905.

7. The provisions of the Uganda Agreement, 1900, relating to the administration of justice as amended by the Uganda Agreement (Judicial), 1905, and this Proclamation, and in so far as they are not inconsistent therewith, are hereby confirmed.

8. The Order made by the Acting Commissioner of the Uganda Protectorate under clause 3 of The Uganda Agreement (Judicial), 1905, on the 23rd January, 1905, and the Proclamations relating to Native Courts in Uganda dated respectively the 15th January, 1909, the 3rd March, 1911, the 10th November, 1911, the 6th January, 1913, the 24th May, 1913, the 22nd May, 1914, the 24th June, 1914, the 18th May, 1916, and the 6th July, 1916, are hereby cancelled, but without prejudice always to anything lawfully done thereunder or to the conduct of any proceedings pending at the date of the publication of this Proclamation.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by Paragraph 5 of the Proclamation.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the *London Gazette* and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

† NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country or in any country in the group with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is however, prepared, on application, to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants, in making enquiries, would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to His Majesty's Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

* NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under Berg and Komeet respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

Reduction of Passenger Train Service.

OWING TO THE DIFFICULTY that exists in obtaining the stores and material necessary for the maintenance and repairs of locomotives and rolling stock, and to the great importance of conserving as far as possible all stores and supplies, it is found necessary to reduce the present passenger train service of one train each way daily over the Uganda Railway to four trains each way per week from the Coast to Nakuru, and three trains each way weekly between Nakuru and Kisumu. It may also be necessary to reduce the speed of these trains to enable them to take a greater load. This change will take place on and from Monday, 15th October, 1917, and due notice will be given by the Traffic Manager of the timing of the trains and of the days on which they will run on the different sections of the Railway.
