An Ordinance to Abolish Road and Wharfage Dues.

[1ST APRIL, 1917.]

Enacted by the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Uganda Road and Wharfage Dues (Repeal) Ordinance, 1917, and shall have effect from and after the 1st April, 1917.

Short title and
commence-
ment.

2. The Uganda Road and Wharfage Dues Ordinance, 1902, and the Uganda Road and Wharfage Dues (Amendment) Ordinance, 1912, are hereby repealed but without prejudice always to anything lawfully done thereunder or to the prosecution of any offence committed or the collection of any dues payable before the commencement of this Ordinance.

ORDINANCE, 1904.

NOTICE.

1. Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is however, prepared, on application, to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants, in making enquiries, would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to His Majesty's Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

IT IS HEREBY NOTIFIED for general information that the Minister of Munitions has had under consideration the procedure which should be adopted in the case of orders from Colonies not possessing Responsible Government and Protectorates for the supply from the United Kingdom of machinery and other materials (such as steel, tin-plates, copper-wire, etc.,) for which there is a demand for war purposes.

The position is that these materials cannot be supplied either for home use or for exportation, without a certificate from the Ministry of Munitions, and that licences for their exportation will not be granted by the War Trade Department unless such a certificate is produced. As it is difficult for the Minister of Munitions in many cases to decide whether such a certificate should be granted for an order from one of His Majesty's oversea possessions without fuller knowledge than he possesses as to the urgency of the demand in the Colony or Protectorate for the material in question and the possibility of meeting the demand from other sources,—*e.g.*, from local stocks or countries other than the United Kingdom, or by substitutes,—all such orders from Colonies and Protectorates will in the first instance be examined locally by the Chief Secretary to whom all persons having orders for the materials in question to be supplied from the United Kingdom should, in the first instance, make application.

3. In the event of an application being received by the Ministry of Munitions, unaccompanied by the recommendation of the Chief Secretary, the applicant will be informed that no action can be taken until he has obtained the recommendation of the local authority.

4. Applications should be made on a standard form which is in course of preparation but which has not yet been received.
