PROCLAMATION.

NATIVE COURTS IN MBALE.

IN EXERCISE of the powers vested in me, I hereby declare and proclaim as follows:—

The Schedule substituted by the Proclamation of the 10th March, 1913, for the Schedule to the Proclamation of the 10th January, 1912, establishing Native Courts in Mbale is amended—

(1) by substituting "Leo Wakida" for "Sedulaka" as President of the County Court of Bugweri, at Budaka.

(2) by deleting the words and figures:—

" 2. The Court of the Regent of Budaka, at Budaka"

and " 10. The Court of the Chief (Sub-chief) of Kadawa, at Kadawa" and re-numbering the remaining Courts in the County of Bugweri accordingly.

(3) by substituting "Koboi" for "Tuke" as President of the County Court of Pallisa, at Pallisa.

(4) by deleting the word "(Sub-chief)" after the word "Chief" in the description of Courts Nos. 9 and 10 in the County of Bunyuli.

(5) by deleting the words and figures:—

" 5. The Court of the Chief of the Bakasakia clan, at Bakasakia"

and " 7. The Court of the Chief of the Bafwode clan, at Busane" and re-numbering Court No. 6 in the County of Central Bugishu accordingly.

PASSPORT REGULATIONS.

TRAVELLING OF WOMEN AND CHILDREN.

THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS with regard to women and children desiring to travel on British vessels have been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies and are published for general information :—

- (a) Passports to travel through any danger zone will be issued only in very urgent cases such as for war work, or exceptionally pressing domestic, health or business reasons.
- (b) Women and children arriving at Colonial Ports *en route* elsewhere will be allowed to proceed, but warned of the risk involved.
- (c) Wives and families will not be permitted to proceed abroad merely because the husband or father holds an official position.
- (d) Subject to proviso (a) the issue of passports rests in the discretion of the Officer Administering the Government of the Protectorate or his Deputy and the conditions will be very strictly interpreted.
- (e) In issuing passports preference will be given to the safer of any alternative routes and permission to travel through the Mediterranean until further notice will be accorded only in cases of great emergency.

2. No restriction will be placed on the movements of women or children travelling on vessels of allied or neutral nationality.

3. The regulations contained in *Gazette* Notice No. 69, dated the 22nd February, 1917, are hereby superseded.

## UGANDA RAILWAY

## Tariff Book No. 9.

PUBLIC NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the following alterations, etc., have been made in the above issue of the Tariff Book:—

## SECTION 13 OF PART 2, PAGE 30:—

Delete clause (a) and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

- (a). The Administration does not undertake to refund the value of lost, mislaid, or destroyed tickets, or of any fares which in consequence of the loss, destruction or mislaying of such tickets may have been paid a second time.

## SECTION 15 OF PART 6, PAGES 145—147:—

Delete all clauses under Sub-section (d) and insert the following in lieu thereof:—

- (d). Travelling Cranes.

When the weight of a consignment to be handled is beyond the lifting capacity of the fixed crane at a station, or where there is no fixed crane, the Administration will provide a crane, if available, upon a written request and an undertaking to pay the following charges:—

1. A haulage charge of 50 cents per mile for the distance from the point at which the crane is permanently stationed to the point at which it is to be used and also the same charge for the return journey, *viz.*, Re. 1/- per mile to cover the return journey, and a charge of Rs. 30/- for hire for a time not exceeding 6 working hours.
2. If a Travelling Crane after arrival at a station is detained for use for a period exceeding 6 working hours a charge of Rs. 5/- will be levied for each hour or part thereof the travelling crane is detained over 6 working hours.
3. If labour additional to that of the Travelling Crane staff is required the same can only be provided on payment being guaranteed of all expenses in respect thereof.
4. A Travelling Crane if required at a point distant 100 miles or over from the point at which it is permanently stationed will, if available, be supplied under special arrangement only. Charges will be quoted on application to the Traffic Manager.
