# An Ordinance relating to Compulsory Military and other Service.

[30TH APRIL, 1917.]

Enacted by the Governor of the Uganda Protectorate.

- I. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Com- Short title. pulsory Service Ordinance, 1917."
- II. Every male person between the ages of 18 Males liable to and 45 shall be liable to be called upon to serve in any serve against military capacity in connection with the operations German East against German East Africa, and upon being called upon such person shall forthwith proceed to report himself for service at such place whether within or without the Protectorate as shall be notified to him and shall become subject to military discipline and to all laws and regulations and orders affecting persons engaged in such operations as officers or soldiers as the case may be.

Africa,

III. Every such male person as aforesaid shall or to undertake also be liable to be called upon to perform any duty in Uganda. Uganda which in the opinion of the War Council is subsidiary to the prosecution of the war including office work and the recruiting of native soldiers and the management and control of carriers. Every person called upon under this section shall be subject to military law as enacted by the King's African Rifles Ordinance, 1911, and any Ordinance amending or substituted for the same.

IV. (1) The Governor may appoint a War Council Appointment of War of which the Chief Secretary to the Government or Gouncil. such other officer as the Governor may appoint shall be President. Such Council shall consist of as many members as the Governor may direct.

(2) The Governor may appoint in each Province Provincial a Provincial Committee of which the Provincial Commissioner shall be Chairman. Such committee shall consist of as many members as the Governor in each case may direct.

- (3) The Governor may at any time dispense with the services of any member of the War Council or any member of a Provincial Committee.
- V. (1) The War Council when required by the Duty of War Governor to provide such number of males of European or Asiatic origin as the Governor may direct shall select as required for military sarvice such males as it may think fit. for military service such males as it may think fit.

- (2) The War Council shall in selecting males in accordance with sub-section (1) have due regard to the necessities of civil life and to the circumstances of such case.
- (3) The males selected by the War Council shall be served with notices requiring them to serve in accordance with section II. of this Ordinance or to undertake duty in Uganda in accordance with section III. and shall proceed to such destination and on such date as the notices may direct to report themselves for service to the proper authority.

Selection by Provincial Committee. VI. Each Provincial Committee shall keep the War Council informed of the economic conditions prevailing in its Province and the names of such males as in its opinion may be selected for military service having due regard to the necessities of civil life and the circumstances of each case.

Subjects of Foreign Powers excluded. VII. Nothing in this Ordinance shall apply to a subject of a Foreign Power.

Power to make Rules.

- VIII. The Governor may from time to time make rules :—
- (1) Prescribing anything authorised by this Ordinance to be prescribed;
- (2) Prescribing the procedure to be adopted by Provincial Committees appointed under this Ordinance; and
- (3) Generally for carrying out the purposes of this Ordinance.

Employees and others engaged in civil works not to abandon it without leave of Committee.

No person who has undertaken to perform IX. work or supervision for or on behalf of any person performing any military duty shall accept service in any military corps or abandon the work or supervision on which he is for the time being employed without the sanction of the Provincial Committee and no person who is an employee under a contract subject to notice shall leave such employment or give notice to leave the same without the like sanction. Such sanction may be given on such terms as the committee may think fit. Provided that if such sanction is refused the person applying for the same may appeal to the War Council whose decision shall be final and binding. Provided that any person who is employed by any other person may leave such employment with his employer's consent without application to the Provincial Committee.

Male persons not to leave Protectorate without consent of War Council.

- Rates of pay and terms of service.
- X. No male person being a British subject of European birth or descent between the ages of 18 and 45 shall leave the Protectorate without the consent in writing of the President of the War Council.
- XI. The Governor may prescribe rates of pay and terms of service in cases where any person is serving in a capacity for which such rates and terms shall not have been prescribed by the proper authority.

Penalties.

XII. Any person committing a breach of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any instructions or directions lawfully given under this Ordinance shall on conviction be liable to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three years or to fine of Rs. 1,000 or to both.

# THE COMPULSORY SERVICE ORDINANCE, 1917.

# RULES,

# THE COMPULSORY SERVICE RULES, 1917.

- 1. THESE RULES may be cited as "The Compulsory Service Rules, 1917."
- 2. Every male person being a British subject of European race or extraction shall cause his full name and address to be registered personally or by letter at the office of the Provincial Commissioner of the Province in which he resides within 30 days from the publication of these rules.
- 3. (1) The Chairman of a Provincial Committee may by notice in writing direct any male person being a British subject between the ages of 18 and 45 residing in the Province to present himself at such time and place as the Chairman may specify for medical examination by a Government Medical Officer or by a Military Medical Officer or by a Medical Officer appointed by the Governor in that behalf with a view to finding out such person's fitness for military service.
- (2) Every male person as aforesaid shall present himself for medical examination at the time and place specified in the notice.
- (3) The Medical Officer shall make a report in writing to the Chairman of the Provincial Committee on every such person examined and shall state in such report if the person examined—
  - (a) is fit for general military service in the field or (b) is fit for service in the Military Labour Corps or

(c) is fit for camp or office work or

- (d) is totally unfit for military service of any description.
- 4. Upon receiving such report the Chairman may give such person not being in the service of the Government notice to appear before the Provincial Committee at the place and on the date specified in such notice to shew cause why his name should not be submitted to the War Council as being a fit person to be called upon to serve under the Ordinance. In default of appearance as aforesaid the person named shall be liable to be reported to the War Council as a fit person in accordance with his medical report.
- 5. An employer may either in person or in writing apply for the exemption of any of his employees. Such application shall be made to the Provincial Committee of the Province in which such employee resides.
- 6. The War Council may after consultation with the Heads of Government Departments and subject to the approval of the Governor select for military service those civil servants who can be spared for military service without unduly embarrassing the public service.
- 7. In considering claims for exemption the Provincial Committees shall take into account the following:—

(a) the safety of the district,

- (b) the circumstances of each applicant,(c) the interest of the employer (if any),
- (d) the nature and value of the work performed by the applicant or his employer in the production of commodities of economic value.

- 8. In reporting the names of persons to the War Council the Chairman of the Provincial Committee shall forward to the War Council full particulars (a) of any medical or other reason adduced by or on behalf of any male person claiming exemption from military service together with the committee's recommendation on such claim (b) of any work or supervision which such person may have undertaken for or on behalf of any person serving in a military capacity (c) of the employment upon which the person is engaged and the effect thereon of his removal.
- 9. The War Council shall consider the Provincial Committee's report and may either grant or withhold certificate of exemption but in the latter case they shall give to the applicant and his employer (if any) an opportunity of being heard in support of the claim, and they may if they think fit require the applicant to undergo such further medical examination as they may direct.
- 10. The grant of a certificate of exemption may be made conditionally on the applicant's undertaking any specified work or supervision on behalf of a person serving in a military capacity. Any certificate of exemption shall be liable to be revoked at any time for reasons to be stated in writing but no order shall be made under this rule without hearing the person and his employer if any and the decision of the War Council shall be final and not subject to appeal.
- 11. A quorum of the War Council for the purpose of these rules shall be any number not less than three members.
- 12. For the purpose of these rules the term employer shall include any person acting as agent for or manager on behalf of an employer.
- 13. The forms in the schedule may be used for the purposes to which they relate.
- 14. These Rules shall not apply to any person serving in any of His Majesty's Forces other than the Uganda Volunteer Reserve.
- 15. Members of recognised Missionary Bodies shall not be selected under the foregoing rules but if the Bishop or other Head of any such Body is of opinion that any member thereof can reasonably be spared he shall submit his name to the War Council for selection.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having any dealings with any of the persons or firms mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No. 3.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in 'the List has more than one address in the same country, all dealings in that country with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses is most fact. specifically mentioned.

\*Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is however, prepared, on application, to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants, in making enquiries, would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required.

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also telegraphed to His Majesty's Ambassador' at Washington, who transmits them to His Majesty's Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.
